

# Waste sorting guide

- to be used if you live in an apartment

## Waste food

- bread
- coffee grounds
- vegetable waste
- fruit peel
- egg shells



Flowers should be sorted as other household waste.

## Cardboard packaging

- milk cartons
- toilet rolls
- wrapping paper
- paper bags



## Plastic packaging

- plastic bags
- sauce bottles
- shampoo bottles
- plastic jars
- plastic caps
- disposable cups



## Bulky waste

- refrigerators and freezers
- furniture
- car batteries
- TVs
- large boxes
- vacuum cleaners
- large toys, e.g. bikes and sledges



## Coloured glass

Remove any corks and tops from bottles and jars (and place them in the correct waste receptacle).



Porcelain/crockery should be sorted as other household waste.

## Clear glass

Remove any corks and tops from bottles and jars (and place them in the correct waste receptacle).



Window glass should be sorted as bulky waste.

## Newspapers and magazines

- magazines
- office paper
- daily newspapers
- advertising leaflets



Envelopes should be sorted as other household waste.

## Other household waste

- vacuum cleaner bags
- flowers
- pens
- serviettes
- dishcloths
- envelopes
- tobacco
- CDs



## Hazardous waste

Hazardous waste includes light bulbs, electronics and batteries.



## Metal packaging

- aluminium foil
- dried paint tins
- capsules
- tin cans
- aerosols
- tubes
- candle holders



Aerosols must not contain any gas.
